
NATIONAL ANIMAL CRUELTY INVESTIGATIONS SCHOOL

The National Animal Cruelty Investigations School offers a combination of specialized veterinary and law enforcement training. Students from a range of backgrounds – including federal, state and local animal cruelty officers, humane society investigators and board members, police officers and sheriffs' deputies, court personnel and other citizens – learn from experts about all aspects of animal welfare and safety.

Our nationally recognized faculty of law enforcement, veterinary and animal health experts teach a systematic approach to animal cruelty investigations. Classes are held all over the United States. The program has three different components that should be taken in order; requests to take them out of order will be considered on a case-by-case basis. Each component is composed of a 5-day, 40-hour course conducted from 7:30 a.m. to 5 p.m. Monday through Thursday. Friday's course will also begin at 7:30 a.m., but conclude sometime in the afternoon. After completion of all three components (120 hours), you will be a certified humane investigator.

Group discount/early registration discount

Register three students from one agency, and get additional registrations for 50 percent off the full registration. Registrations must be submitted together, and all registrants must attend to qualify. Save 10 percent for registering 45 days prior to training. Registrations will be accepted until the week prior to training, but we reserve the right to cancel the class 30 days prior to the start date (Sept. 8, 2018) due to low registrations.

Continuing education

For each level, participants with a grade of 70 percent or more on the written examination will receive a certificate of completion and 40 continuing education units.

Registration preference will go to investigators with active investigations. Due the nature of the business, topics discussed and videos shown during the schools will have graphic content and may not be suitable for everyone.
