The purpose of this course is to provide basic knowledge in the field of Bloodstain Pattern Analysis and enable course participants to identify, document, and interpret bloodstain evidence. This is an 8-hour course that includes Basic Bloodstain Pattern Identification, Pattern Analysis, and Basic Origin Determination.

Participants of this course will be able to properly record a crime scene for analysis and subsequent court presentation by a qualified analyst, should an analyst not be available at the scene.

Covered Topics include History of bloodstain pattern analysis theory, Special photographic requirements, Measurements of bloodstains, DNA requirements

Using bloodstain patterns to reconstruct crime scenes, Pattern Identification Angle of Impact, Area of Origin Determination Bloodstain, Scene Interpretation, Court Testimony.

Upon completion the student will be able to:

Recognize the different forms of blood patterns, Know what mechanisms cause them, Be able to make a global interpretation of what might have happened and Know the possibilities of forensic blood pattern analysis
