Summary:

This one day course will cover basic Spanish grammar and pronunciation, useful and common words and phrases, commands, and officer safety words. There will also be a discussion of cultural differences, the current political climate as well as the concerns of the members of the Latino community.

Chris Nuccio is a Corporal with the Springfield, MO Police Department, currently assigned as a Patrol Squad Major Crimes Investigator in the Uniform Operations Bureau. He began his career with Springfield in 2004 after completing his enlistment in the United States Army. While in the Army, Corporal Nuccio studied Spanish at the Defense Language Institute in Monterey, California where he graduated as a certified Spanish Linguist & Voice Intercept Analyst. He was assigned as a Voice Intercept Analyst with the 10th Mountain Division in Fort Drum, NY.

He has been called upon countless times to perform field translation for incidents ranging from simple traffic stops to serious Assault investigations. He holds a Bachelor Degree in Criminal Justice from Drury University, a P.O.S.T. Generalist certification and is the primary Spanish For Law Enforcement Instructor for the Springfield Police Department Training Academy and In-Service Training.

Gerardo R. Martinez, MBA Gerardo received his Master of Business Administration from Regiomontana University in Monterrey, México. He is the program director of Alianzas (Alliances), a joint program of UMKC-Institute for Human Development and MU Extension. Alianzas addresses concerns of Latino communities within Missouri and enhances statewide collaborative efforts by promoting intercultural communication and integration. Gerardo is a certified teacher of the National Cultural Dimensions concepts developed by Dr. Geert Hofstede of ITIM international.
